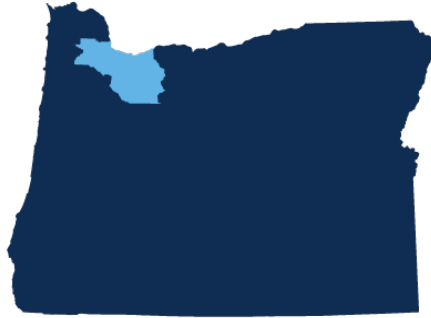


MINIMUM WAGE INCREASE – GET THE FACTS

Oregon's minimum wage will increase over the next six years starting on July 1, 2016. Here's what you need to know:

PORTLAND URBAN GROWTH BOUNDARY:

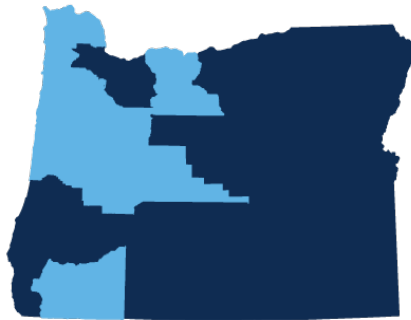
Counties: Multnomah and parts of Washington and Clackamas counties.
